Exemptions for Homeowners (RSA 319-C:15) The electrical licensing requirements do not apply to "a homeowner making electrical installations in or about a single family residence owned and occupied by him or her or to be occupied by him or her as his or her bona fide personal abode." This only applies if the homeowner is actually installing the work. Homeowners who apply for and are issued electrical permits and then decide to contract with a licensed electrician, for all or a portion of the work, shall have the licensed electrician apply and obtain an electrical permit for the work being done by the licensed electrician. The homeowner shall not obtain an electrical permit and then have someone else (licensed or not) do the work under the permit obtained by the owner.
